Conditional Exemption for Chlorine-Based Additives in Re-pulping

Standard for Sanitary Paper Products (GS-1)

August 25, 2021. Green Seal has issued Edition 6.4 of the Standard for Sanitary Paper Products (GS-1). This edition includes a conditional exemption that allows for the use of chlorine or chlorine derivatives during the re-pulping phase of the papermaking process when included for the purpose of breaking down recovered material containing wet-strength resins.
